Basic Stitches for embroidery



Fabric
• avoid stretching fabric!



Hoop (optional)
to taut the fabric makes it easier to work



Thread
consists of 6 Strands use a subset to make thinner lines



Needle
ball-point or sharp

Utensils

Satin Stitch

Basic Fill-Stitch
→ use the Back Stitch to outline to get even edges.



Padded Satin Stitch

the little stitches underneath elevate the stitch. This is good for smaller areas as a stabilizer



Long-Short Stitch

good for working with color gradients

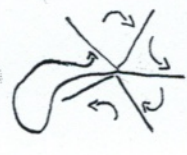


woven wheel

1) make 5 (or more) over stitches from a can



2) go through the middle and weave the thread alternating under and over the stitches



Creates "Rose-like" Flowers

French Knot



- 1) wrap the thread around the needle and keep it firm
- 2) Pull the needle through the knot before releasing the thread

STEM STITCH

• good for curves
• used for curvy text and flowers stems.

• good for straight lines
• often used to outline patterns and for text

BACK STITCH

CHAIN STITCH

• good for curved and straight lines.

- ① make a small stitch
- ② loop the thread through the small stitch

- ③ loop through the chain

Lazy Daisy

make flowers with single chain stitches
